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- HUD will provide communities with a list of CoC renewal projects to review
- There will be a process to correct the list
- No application process for providers
- HUD anticipates bill to pass in December to allow this process to occur

# DedicatedPLUS

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- BOS converted all CoC funded Permanent Supportive Housing projects from being 100% dedicated to people experiencing chronic homelessness to using HUD's DedicatedPlus eligibility criteria in the 2019 CoC competition
- CANs scheduled to begin referring applicants based on DedicatedPLUS eligibility criteria beginning January 2021.
- The necessary updates to CT CAN policies and procedures are currently in progress.

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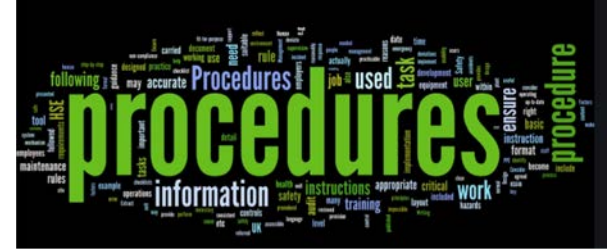

# Reminder: Reallocation Criteria



CT BOS uses the following criteria to identify projects for possible reallocation:

- Projects that are underperforming.
- To ensure efficient use of resources, for example to address:
  - under spending, high costs, program vacancies
- Using outdated program models
- Monitoring findings/other info indicate project is out of compliance w/HUD, state, or CT BOS requirements and agency is unable/unwilling to make necessary corrections
- Projects also have the option to voluntarily reallocate to make better use of CoC resources.



# Reminder: Reallocation Procedures

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- Steering Committee (SC) determines if projects will be reallocated in whole or in part.
- Projects slated for full or partial reallocation may submit an appeal - Grievance Committee hears and decides appeals.
- SC decides how to best allocate funds for new projects, including reallocated funds, bonus dollars, and any other source.
- CoC solicits new project apps from all eligible organizations, including those that have never received CoC Program funds

# Voting: Proposed By-Laws Change- Motion #1

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**MOTION #1 - To add the following into Article VI Section 6: CT BOS Steering Committee Meetings and Attendance:**

At the chairs' discretion, the CT BOS Steering Committee may be convened remotely via video and/or telephone conferencing.



# Voting: Proposed By-Laws Change - Motion #2

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## **MOTION #2 - To add the following into Article VI Section 5: CT BOS Steering Committee Voting:**

- The Steering Committee (SC) shall not vote on matters that have not been discussed at either an in-person or remote meeting.
- Only SC members who participate in the meeting at which a matter is discussed are eligible to participate in any subsequent electronic voting on motions related to that matter.
- The SC shall establish procedures for administering electronic voting.





## Voting: Proposed By-Laws Change – Motion #3

### **MOTION #3 - To add the following into By-Laws Article VI Section 8 CT BOS Steering Committee Co-Chairs:**

- The Co-chairs are authorized to determine: a) when a matter is time sensitive, b) that a decision on a time sensitive matter should not be delayed until such a time as the SC can convene, and c) that a decision on the matter should be made promptly by the Co-chairs. It is anticipated that such a determination will be rare and made only in response to unusual circumstances.
- Such a determination must be approved by **two-thirds** of the Co-chairs. **When such a determination is made, SC members shall be notified and invited to submit input on the matter in advance of a decision by the Co-chairs.**
- Decisions made under the circumstances described above must be approved by **two-thirds** of the Co-chairs.



## Voting: Proposed By-Laws Change – Motion #3 (2)

### **MOTION #3 - To add the following into By-Laws Article VI Section 8 CT BOS Steering Committee Co-Chairs:**

- At the SC meeting that follows such a decision, the Co-chairs will make a report regarding a) the reasons why a decision needed to be made promptly by the Co-Chairs, b) the outcome of the Co-Chairs' decision, and c) the rationale for that decision. **The Steering Committee may opt to alter the decision at any time.**
- Such a report shall be documented in SC minutes. This report provides SC members with an opportunity to raise for discussion by the full SC any decisions made on their behalf by the Co-chairs.
- The Co-chairs shall not make decisions on matters that require a quorum as specified in Article VI Section 7 (B) of these by-laws



## Voting: Proposed Policy Change – Motion #4

### **MOTION #4: To add the following into CT BOS Policies: Section IX. Remote Steering Committee Voting Procedures**

- As per the CoC's by-laws, at the chairs' discretion, the SC may be convened remotely via video and/or telephone conferencing. Only SC members who participate in the remote meeting at which a matter is discussed are eligible to vote on motions related to that matter. Remote SC voting will be administered as follows:
  - SC members will be reminded at the start of each meeting that to be eligible to vote either during the meeting or through subsequent electronic voting conducted on matters discussed during the meeting, they must do one of the following: a) Show their full name in the video conferencing application, or b) State at the beginning of the meeting when prompted that they are present.
- Member of the CoC consultant team will record the names of all participants in mtg minutes.



## Voting: Proposed Policy Change – Motion #4 (2)

### **MOTION #4: To add the following into CT BOS Policies: Section IX. Remote Steering Committee Voting Procedures**

- Remote SC voting will be administered as follows:
  - The chairs will determine the method to be used for voting by the SC during or subsequent to a remote meeting.
  - When decisions are being made by consensus or voice vote during a remote SC meeting, a reminder about who is eligible to vote shall be provided. The meeting chair, w/assistance as requested from the consulting team, will ensure that only eligible SC members vote.
  - When votes are being administered electronically (e.g., via email or web-based survey) those casting a vote will be required to provide their name and, if applicable, the entity they represent on the SC. A member of the CoC consulting team will ensure that only votes cast by eligible SC members are counted.
