3. 2020 Planning Grant Allocation & Discussion

- Each year the CoC receives HUD planning funds to support the work of the CoC.
- Eligible activities were reviewed.
- The CoC is soliciting ideas from the Steering Committee on what projects should be funded (Planning Grant period: 7/1/21-6/30/22).

- There have been several suggestions including:
 - o using funding to expand and implement the racial equity work in BOS;
 - o improving outreach data processes to ensure that staff has the technology they need to collect and maintain data on outreach clients;
 - maintaining a Web-based Training Platform that could also be shared with partner agencies;
 - o providing RRH case conferencing to support the efforts of RRH agencies.
 - All agencies that receive Planning Grant funds are required to complete the budget template: <u>Planning Budget Template</u>

4. Attendance/Voting

- Attendance Policy
 - For SC members to be recorded as present and eligible to vote either during the meeting or through subsequent electronic voting conducted on matters discussed during the meeting, they must do one of the following:
 - a) Show their full name in the video conferencing application, or
 - b) State at the beginning of the meeting when prompted that they are present
- There was a review of who was eligible to vote.
- Conflict of Interest (COI)
 - Conflict of Interest Forms are due 1/10/21. Steering Committee members are required to complete the COI each year even if they do not have a known COI.
 - COI can exist when there is a situation in which a person has competing commitments, obligations, duties or goals. These situations can result in real or perceived lack of independence or impartiality. For example, when a SC member, a member of his/her immediate family, or his/her business associate has an interest, financial or otherwise, whether as employee, owner, fiduciary, consultant, Board member, or supplier or recipient of goods or services, in any program or agency that receives Continuum of Care funds.

5. Reallocation Discussion

- For the 2021 HUD CoC Competition, there will be project reallocations to consider, and the SC needs to decide on how to proceed in making decisions regarding these reallocations. The following proposals were made:
 - 1. Steering Committee (SC) is made aware of the projects that are being proposed for reallocation and votes on whether to reallocate their funding.
 - 2. Steering Committee makes the decision to reallocate the funding WITHOUT knowing the agencies to be reallocated.
 - 3. Steering Committee yields the reallocation decision to the SC Chairs.
 - Two people commented in support of option #2.

f/u: SC members should come prepared to vote in January on which of the above will be used to decide on how to move ahead on reallocation.

6. CCEH Updates

Updates on Housing Inventory Chart/Point-in-time Count

- CCEH presented the 2021 Point-in-time Count of Homeless Persons Methodology.
 <u>Proposed 2021 PIT Methodology</u>
 - Sheltered Methodology
 - No methodology changes in the sheltered methodology from last year.
 - For clients staying in hotels a separate PIT database entry will be necessary to record how many clients slept in hotel vs shelter. This is to be completed night of count (Tuesday, January 26, 2021).
 - Unsheltered Methodology Changes from 2020 include:
 - The count will rely on outreach team and there will be no volunteers.
 - There will be no systematic sampling or weighting low probability areas.
 - The focus will be on using existing data and on known clients and high probability areas.
 - There will be an emphasis on improving data collection options and both HMIS and non-HMIS users will be participating.
 - HUD approved the revised methodology.
 - Steering Committee approved the proposed methodology by consensus
 - o How will this year work?
 - Current PATH and street outreach programs will staff the outreach efforts.
 - ⇒ If you do not have an outreach project in HMIS but have HMIS access, use the NEW PIT Outreach program in HMIS.
 - Data collection option for those who do not have HMIS access (soup kitchens, municipalities, etc.).
 - ⇒ Paper and mobile-ready online form
 - ⇒ Captures demographic and characteristic data
 - Timeline was reviewed.

7. PSH Prioritization Criteria – Revisions to CAN Policies

- BOS converted all CoC funded Permanent Supportive Housing projects from being 100% dedicated to people experiencing chronic homelessness to using HUD's DedicatedPlus eligibility criteria in the 2019 CoC competition. CANs will start making DedicatedPlus referrals in Jan 2021.

- o Section G. Prioritization for PSH Under Special Circumstances.
