

June 18, 2021 - 200 of the total 380 vouchers allocated to CANs




New – CDC Eviction Moratorium



- Targeted Federal <u>CDC Eviction Moratorium</u> expires 10/3/21
 - Applies to counties experiencing substantial and high levels of community transmission (see slide #11)
- Requires a declaration:
 - Declaration Form in English
 - Declaration form in Spanish
 - Best efforts to: obtain all available rent/housing assistance; and make timely partial payments as circumstances permit
 - Meet income limits (see slide #12)
 - Unable to pay full rent due to loss of income/extraordinary medical expenses; evictions for other reasons not covered
 - Eviction would result in homelessness or close quarters
 - If previously filed a declaration do not need to file a new declaration those who still qualify are covered

CDC – COVID-19 Integrated County View

- As of 8/4/21, all counties in CT indicated at substantial level of community transmission.
- If county no longer experiences substantial or high transmission for 14 consecutive days, then moratorium will no longer apply until substantial or high levels resume.



CDC Eviction Moratorium-Income Limits

- 1. Earned no more than \$99K (or \$198K if filing jointly) in CY2020; or expects to earn no more than those limits in CY2021;
- 2. Was not required to report any income in 2020 to the IRS; or
- 3. Received an Economic Impact Payment (stimulus check).

XAM

Extended - CT Executive Order #12D

- Extended through 9/30/21
- Requires Landlords to apply to <u>Unite CT</u>
 prior to delivery of a *Notice to Quit (NtQ)*for non-payment of rent.
- Most NtQs must have a move out date that is at least 30 days after the NtQ serve date.
- Tenants have 30 days to pay back rent or apply to <u>Unite CT</u>. Eviction case will be put on hold for 30 days or until Unite CT application is processed.



UPDATED – <u>CDC General Mask</u> Guidance for Vaccinated People

- Wear a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission.
- You might choose to wear a mask regardless of transmission in your area if:
 - weakened immune system;
 - age or medical condition increases risk for severe disease; or
 - live with someone unvaccinated, with a weakened immune system, or at increased risk for severe disease.



UNCHANGED – CDC Mask Guidance for Shelters

- All shelter staff and volunteers should wear a mask regardless of vaccination status.
- All clients should wear masks any time they are not in their room or on their bed/mat (in shared sleeping areas), regardless of vaccination status.
- Masks should not be placed on children under 2 years old, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.



New – CDC Guidance for Exposure


Fully vaccinated people who have a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 should:

- be tested 3-5 days after exposure; AND
- wear a mask in public indoor settings for 14 days after exposure or until a negative test result.






NEW Study on Efficacy of Portable HEPA filters and Masking



- Using two portable HEPA air cleaners close to an aerosol source reduced aerosol exposure by up to 65%.
- A combination of HEPA air cleaners and universal masking reduced exposure by up to 90%.

- The <u>third round of Economic Impact Payments</u> are being sent in phases.
- Each week IRS is sending EIP Payments as tax returns are processed. If you haven't received a payment yet, it doesn't mean you won't.

REMINDER – Child Tax Credit

Child tax credit:

- \$3K/child ages 6 to 17
- \$3.6K/child <6 years old



Get the full credit if modified adjusted gross income is:

- \$75,000 or less for single filers
- \$150,000 or less for married couples filing a joint tax return
- \$112,500 or less for "head of household" filers (often unmarried single parents).



- Advance monthly payments for half of the total credit amount
- Claim the remaining half when filing a 2021 income tax return

IRS tools available to:

- Check Eligibility
- Register for advance payments if you don't usually file a return
- Check if you're enrolled to receive payments
- Provide or update your bank account information or mailing address
- View payment history

Reminder: CoC Income Exclusions

Excluded when determining CoC participant income:

- EIP
- Child Tax Credits
- Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC)
- Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)

Reminder - HUD COVID-19 Waivers Extended

- Expiration date of 9/30/21 for waivers previously authorized until public health officials determine no additional special measures are necessary to prevent the spread of COVID-19
- Waivers extended through 9/30/21 or 12/31/21
- Details available:

HUD COVID-19 Waiver Notification



Grantees must notify HUD of intent to use extensions:

Waiver Notification Template

- Notify Hartford Field Office in writing no less than 2 days before using the waiver flexibility: <u>CPD_COVID-</u> <u>19WaiverHAT@hud.gov</u>
- •DMHAS & DOH notified HUD already; Subrecipients of DOH/DMHAS should not submit waiver notification.
- Agencies receiving CoC funds directly from HUD need to submit their own notification.
