- 7 projects resubmitted 2023 applications.
- Projects that did not meet threshold have been notified.
- Scoring Committee meets in May
- When HUD releases NOFO we will know how much funding is available.
- Projects approved for submission to HUD will be notified this summer.



# Renewal Evaluation Highlights

- 123 projects were scored
- Average Score was 82
- 29 projects scored 100
- 10 projects scored 50 or below
- Scoring factor with the highest score was Participant Survey response
- Scoring factors with the lowest scores were Non-Cash benefits (Adult Programs) & Earned Income (Youth Programs)
- Participants indicate a high level of satisfaction

# 2024 Renewal Evaluation Results -- Spending





# Met or Exceeded Standards – Adult Programs

- Occupancy 90%/100%\*
- Consumer Survey Response rate 35%/79%
- PSH: Percentage of participants exiting to permanent housing 95%/97%
- RRH: Percentage of participants housed within 30 days – 50%/62%
- RRH: Length of Stay is 6 months or less 40%/50%

\*1<sup>st</sup> number is standard, 2<sup>nd</sup> is performance



# Performed Below Standards Adult Programs

- \*1<sup>st</sup> number is standard, 2<sup>nd</sup> is performance
- All adult participants with NON-CASH benefits excluding health insurance – 95%/88%\*
- RRH: Percentage of leavers who exited to permanent housing – 95%/94%\*

#### Not Scored:

- Percentage of participants who increased earned income from entry to exit/follow-up – 25%/9%\*
- PSH: Percentage of participants housed w/in 30 days
   85%/50%\*

# Proposed Project-Level Evaluation Measures



#### **Street Outreach Measures:**

- Equitable Service Delivery
  - Different groups (race, ethnicity, gender, age and disability status) are assisted in rates comparable to their presence in the PIT Count
- Exits to Permanent Housing
  - 25% of unsheltered persons who exit the street outreach program exit to a permanent housing destination
- Exits to Positive Destinations
  - 65% of unsheltered persons exit the street outreach program to shelter or other positive destinations

# Proposed Project-Level Evaluation Measures – Used for All Project Types

- Spending (benchmark differs by budget size) – SNOFO grants evaluated at year 3
- 90% occupancy
- 35% response rate for participant surveys – outreach survey to be developed
