



# CT BOS Steering Committee Community Representatives



# Updated CT DOH Statewide RRH Operations Guide



- The Operations Guide was released in 2022, establishing policies and procedures for CT RRH projects funded by DOH, CT BOS and ODFC Continuums of Care.
- An updated version of the <u>CT DOH Statewide RRH Operations Guide</u> is now available on the <u>Resources page</u> of the CT BOS website.

#### Changes include:

- Updated Category 4 definition of homelessness to reflect changes enacted in the 2022 Reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act (p. 121)
- Adjusted examples demonstrating estimation of monthly income (p. 50)

# CT DSS Funding for Community Hubs/Remote Supports

- Community centered entities that organize and support networks of community-based organizations through a centralized administrative and operational infrastructure.
- Intended to be a non-licensed, non-medical model of delivering services in the Remote Supports Program.
- Services provided include supports by staff at a remote location (Hub) who are engaged with the members in their homes through technology.
- Congregate Housing eligible to apply

- PSH Scoring Committee met & RRH/DV Scoring Committee meets in June
- Next Steps:
  - Wait for NOFO release to review HUD's eligibility requirements and priorities
  - Applicants notified once final scoring and ranking are determined
- Recommendations from Scoring Committee Vote
  - Allow funding for families to enhance services in existing PSH Projects
  - Recommend that PSH applicants that did not request admin apply for admin

# Reminder: CT Coordinated Access Network Policies and Procedures Manual Updates



#### What is the manual?

- System guide for Connecticut (CT) Coordinated Access Network (CAN) member agencies & others involved in implementing the CAN strategy
- Describes the system, each component and principles that guide CANs

#### **Major Changes:**

- Revised entry section to include HUBs and revised 211 protocols
- Clarified phased assessment process
- Revised Housing Prioritization to reflect length of time homeless as primary sorting factor
- Rapid Rehousing prioritization at discretion of CAN to allow for a blend of Rapid Exit
   & longer term RRH
- Described By Name List (BNL) 2.0

#### **Major Changes**

- Broadened scope of the guide to cover all PSH funded by CT BOS
- Added/updated notification requirements
- Added information on the CT BOS Grievance process & details regarding security deposit return
- Added that DMHAS PSH projects funded through the 2022 CoC Supplemental Notice of Funding Opportunity (SNOFO) use the broader HUD definition of disabling condition




Are your services needs being met in the program?

Do you feel like you can make decisions about what happens to you in this program?




When you have a problem or complaint, is a staff person available to help you?






CT BOS 2024 Participant Survey



**BOS Spending Results** 





# Spending Challenges

- Tenant rent contribution can be unpredictable
- Difficult and lengthy process to locate units
- Influx of COVID related RRH funding
- PRA programs cannot lease additional scattered site units
- Difficulty filling staff vacancies



# Strategies to Reduce Underspending

- Providers to review spending reports regularly.
- Consider converting from Project-based to Sponsor-based Rental Assistance so additional scatter site units can be added
- Shift funds across Budget Line Items (e.g., from rental assistance to services)
- If project has more units than needed in the CAN, consider reducing units via reallocation.

# Spending Recommendation from Grievance Committee

- Ensure cross CAN collaboration and BNL sharing to help fill vacancies more promptly when no eligible applicant exists in the CAN where the vacancy is.

# CT BOS 2024 Renewal Evaluation Criteria Proposed Changes - Spending (Youth and Adult)



#### Proposed 2024 Spending Criteria:

- Projects over \$2M: leave<\$75K;</li>
- Projects between \$250K & \$2M: spend 90% & leave < \$50k unspent;</li>
- Projects under \$250K: spend90%

# CT BOS 2024 Criteria Proposed Benchmark Changes

#### **Adult Projects** – Add Criteria:

 Track (not score): Percentage of adult participants who increased any case income from entry to exit/follow-up

#### **Youth Projects** – Adjust Benchmarks:

- Percentage of adult participants who increased earned income from exit/follow-up – Increase benchmark from 20% to 25% (Avg performance in 2023: 28%)
- RRH: Percentage of leavers who exited to permanent housing lower benchmark from 95% to 85% (Avg performance in 2023: 82%)





#### CT BOS 2024 Criteria Proposed – Youth Navigators

- Youth Navigator projects have not previously been evaluated
- Proposal to track (not score)
  - Occupancy Benchmark at least 90% (based on Quarterly Count of Households)
  - Spending Benchmark same as all other projects (see slide # 40)
  - Participant Surveys Benchmark at least 35% (same as all other projects)

## Special NOFO (SNOFO) Competition Debriefing: CT BOS Score

- Project Capacity, Review, and Ranking: 3.75/4
- System Performance: 11/18
- CoC Coordination and Engagement: 7.75/8
- CoC Plan for Serving Individuals and Families Experiencing Homelessness with Severe Service Needs: 65.68/70
- Total CT BOS Score: 88.18/100
- Highest Score Nationally: 92.84
- CT BOS was one of just 4 CoCs nationally to get both unsheltered and rural awards.



## SNOFO Updates

- HUD Grant Agreements
  - Field Offices have been trained
  - Issues and Conditions are in eSNAPS,
  - HUD can't execute grants until money is in eLOCCS,
  - Field Offices are prioritizing Quarter 1 CoC Renewals
- Clarification/Highlights from HUD Rural Webinar
  - CT BOS Requires DedicatedPLUS for PSH
  - Special Activities are only eligible in Rural Projects
  - There are quarterly reporting requirements stay tuned for details
