



CT BOS Overview



BOS History

- CT BOS CoC started in 1999
- DMHAS and Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH) played an instrumental role in setting up CT BOS
- CT was not claiming HUD CoC money for certain jurisdictions
- Areas brought together to create BOS CoC
- There were over a dozen small CoCs in the state
- Over the years CoCs merged into BOS






CoC Funding Distribution



PIT Key Findings

From 2021-2022:

- Increase in homelessness overall – 14%
- Increase in ES utilization
- Decrease in:
 - Unsheltered homelessness
 - Chronic homelessness



BOS Updates



Increased Number of People with Lived Expertise to Steering Committee

- Steering Committee comprised of at least two and up to eight Community Representatives Persons with Lived Experience of Homelessness
- Two of the Community Representative seats are for Persons with Lived Experience of Homelessness who are under the age of 25 (i.e., Youth Community Representatives).
- Community Representatives are elected each year

BOS Consumer Leadership Involvement Project (CLIP) Cohort #2

- Goal: Increase quantity and quality of involvement by persons with lived experience's (PLE/consumer) in BOS.
- Coordinated by Corporation for Supportive Housing (CSH)
- Activities include: focus groups, Steering Committee trainings, ensuring greater inclusion of PLEs in Steering Committee structure and decision-making
- $\,\circ\,$ Added a second group of CLIP members Fall 2022
- CLIP #2 includes: Nicholas Galella, Aleena Durant, Tracy Samuel, Raven Johnson and Ebony Beall.





Key CT BOS Policy Updates



BOS Grievance Policy Updates

Changes in Policy include:

- Defining timeframes in Grievance Policy for Consumers
- Clarifying process for CAN Grievances
- Aligning the CT BOS Grievance Policy with the Statewide RRH Operations Guide
- Clarifying and updating Renewal Evaluation Grievances
- Adding a Grievance Policy Notice for participants

CT BOS funded projects and Coordinated Access Networks (CANs) are required to:

- Document provision of this notice to all households seeking or receiving help upon application, at project entry and at a minimum annually; and
- Review the content of the notice with CoC project participants and applicants to help them understand their grievance rights.



BOS Participant Bill of Rights Updates

- Provides rights to applicants and participants getting or asking for help from projects funded by BOS CoC or BOS CAN.
- Provides information on how to get help if rights have been violated
- Examples of rights include (but are not limited to): not to be discriminated against, not to be denied services because of substance use; credit, criminal or housing history; lack of income; to decide who your family is and not be separated from them; to be served based on your gender identity.
- Document was simplified to one page
- Participant Bill of Rights



<u>CT BOS Emergency</u> <u>Transfer Plan</u>

Emergency Transfer Plan Notice

All CANs and CoC/ESG funded projects are required upon application, at project entry, and at annual recertification to:

- Inform all individuals/families seeking or receiving assistance, regardless of known DV survivor status, of their rights under the emergency transfer plan and of the process to seek a transfer.
- Provide a brief user-friendly notice that clearly explains the emergency transfer rights and process

Info for Residents - Emergency Transfer Plan

CT BOS Rights Notices - Acknowledgement of Receipt

Sample form to obtain participant sign-off for the following CT BOS Notices:

- 1. Participant Bill of Rights
- 2. Emergency Transfer
- 3. Grievance

Providers can opt to use a different method to document notification.



Governance Update - CoC Board CT BOS Steering Committee

- The CT BOS Steering Committee is designated as the CoC Board replacing Reaching Home Coordinating Committee
- Related changes were made to the CT BOS Governance Charter & By-laws

Monitoring Updates

- There are no BOS CoC projects being monitored this year, only DMHAS Rental Assistance Projects
- Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) will be monitored
- There is a new Emergency Response section in the Monitoring Guide







2023 HUD CoC Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) Awards

2023 HUD CoC Awards – CT BOS Renewals

All renewals were funded

Total Renewals 97 Projects = \$46,180,433

- Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) 70 Projects = \$33,224,136*
- Rapid Rehousing (RRH) 9 Projects = \$10,020,890*
- Transitional Housing (TH) 8 Projects = \$965,813
- Supportive Services Only 7 Projects = \$1,284,783
- Homeless Management Information System 2 Projects = \$268,631
- Joint TH-RRH 1 Project = \$416,180
- Planning 1 project=\$1,250,000

2023 HUD CoC Awards – CT BOS New Projects

All new project applications were fully funded and include new and expansion projects

Total New Grants 13 projects = \$4,057,409 WHATS NEW?

- 7 PSH Projects = \$1,236,854
- 5 RRH Projects = \$2,297,174
- 1 DV Coordinated Entry Project = \$523,381



Special Notice of Funding Opportunity (SNOFO) BOS Award

SNOFO Award– Total and Unsheltered

- Total Award: \$18,200,171 over 3 years
 - Unsheltered Award: \$17,483,873
 - SSO Street Outreach: \$6,479,192 1 project; Grantee: DMHAS
 - Sub-recipients: Journey Home, New London Homeless Hospitality Center, Liberty, CHD, and Columbus House

PSH: \$6,151,715 – 5 projects; Grantee: DMHAS

- Sub-recipients: Columbus House (2 grants), New Reach, CRT, SVDP Middletown
 SSO Coordinated Entry 1 project \$4,617,456; Grantee: DOH
- Subrecipients TBD
- Planning Grant: \$235, 510 1 project; Grantee: DMHAS
- Subrecipients TBD



Updated CT DOH Statewide RRH Operations Guide




- The Operations Guide was released in 2022, establishing policies and procedures for CT RRH projects funded by DOH, CT BOS and ODFC Continuums of Care.
- An updated version of the <u>CT DOH Statewide RRH Operations Guide</u> is now available on the <u>Resources page</u> of the CT BOS website.

Changes include:

- Updated Category 4 definition of homelessness to reflect changes enacted in the 2022 Reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act (p. 121)
- Adjusted examples demonstrating estimation of monthly income in response to provider comment. Examples now omit references to converting weekly income to monthly income (p. 50)
